

Ethical considerations include obtaining informed consent from all participants, ensuring confidentiality and anonymity, and securing institutional approval from Madrasah Aliyah As'adiyah Uloe. According to Mason (2017), ethical protocols in qualitative research must prioritize participant welfare and data protection. Regular supervision meetings and peer debriefing sessions are conducted to maintain research quality and address any methodological challenges that arise during the research process.
